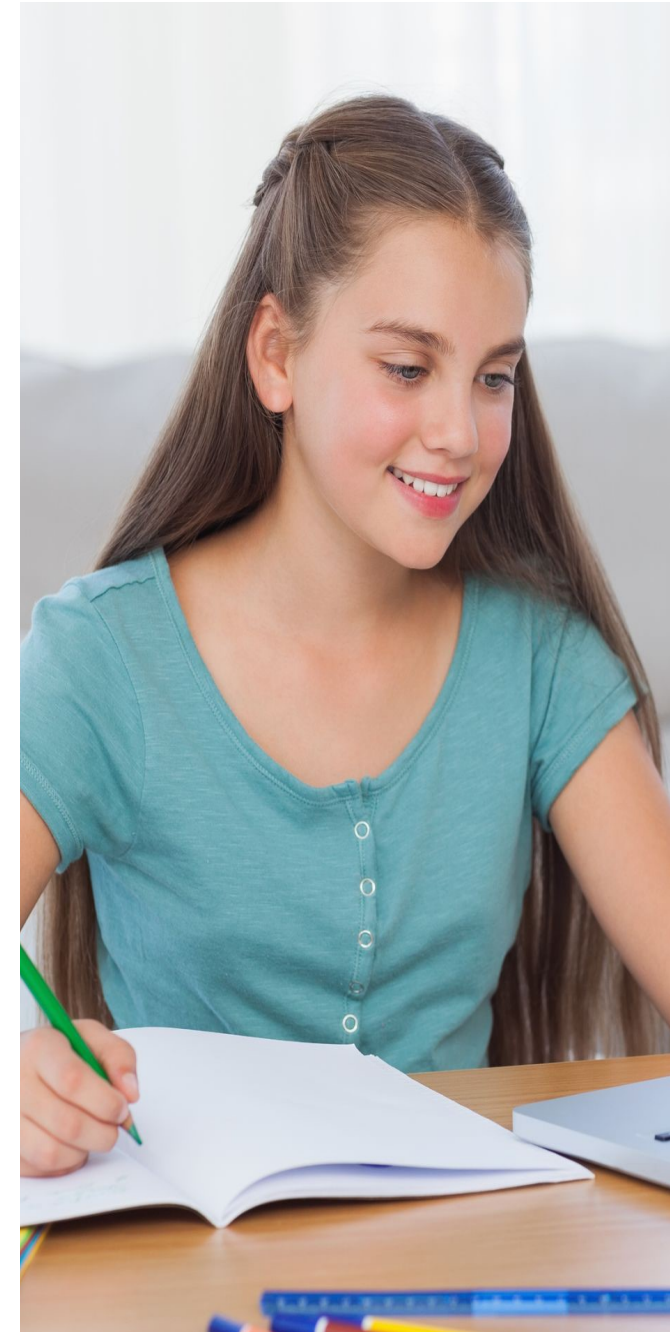

The Bromley 0 to 19 Children's Public Health Service's school nurses work with children and young people in schools and colleges in Bromley, and also with children and young people who are educated at home.

School nurses aim to promote healthy lifestyles amongst children and young people and are available to give advice and support on many health related issues such as:

- sleep
- behaviour
- healthy eating/ exercise
- immunisations
- growth
- bedwetting
- day wetting
- constipation/ soiling
- emotional wellbeing
- smoking
- drugs and alcohol

Children are routinely offered a health screening in schools, regarding their height, weight, and vision; if at any time you are concerned about your child's growth or general health, please contact us to discuss.

It is recommended that all children and young people attend the dentist and optician every year.

Immunisations

You can arrange for your child to receive any immunisation normally given in school at a local clinic. These are:

- Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) age 13
- 3 in 1 teenage booster (DTP) age 14
- Men ACWY age 14

Health education

School nurses can provide one-to-one health education on a range of general health topics including puberty, relationships, online safety, personal hygiene and sexual health.

Advice and support for children and young people

Home educated young people can contact the school nurse to discuss any health concerns that they may have themselves.

Advice and support for parents and carers

The school nurse may be contacted at any time to discuss any health concerns.
