Teachers experience high-quality CPD in working along side them. Where the Teachsport coaches lacked expertise, we drew upon local dance and tennis coaches to top up our offer. We were able to offer outdoor and adventurous learning opportunities for all children, with a focus on outdoor learning for Reception and Year 1 children. Part of this cost was to enable our staff to learn from a seconded outdoor learning leader from another school.
